More than 10 years of work on quality enhancement by AEC Working groups!

- 2002-2004: Project with NASM (US)
- 2006-2007: First review criteria and procedures
- 2007-2014 (Polifonia projects): Criteria and procedures fine-tuned, standards formulated
- 2011-2013: AEC Quality Enhancement Committee
- 7 October 2014: MusiQuE established as an independent legal entity
- June 2016: MusiQuE listed on EQAR (European Quality Assurance Register)

The structure of MusiQuE

- o 3 partner organisations:
 - AEC
 - The European Music Schools Union (EMU)
 - The Performing Arts Employers Associations League Europe (Pearle* - Live Performance Europe)
- o 3 main bodies:
 - MusiQuE Board (5 members)
 - Trained peer-reviewers
 - Supporting staff



Part II: Why MusiQuE? (1)

- 1. The subject-specific answer
 - MusiQuE wants to find subject-specific, selfcontrolled solutions
 - QE in music is different: bringing together artistic standards and educational quality
 - Making QA and accreditation more meaningful to staff and students



Part II: Why MusiQuE? (2)

1. The international answer

- International standards linking back to the sectoral qualifications framework and the international environment
- International procedures
- International peers:
 - Access to a wider pool of specialists
 - Increased objectivity

3 Sets of Standards

8 Domains of enquiry

- 1. Mission and vision /Programme goals and context
- 2. Educational processes
- 3. Student profiles (admission to, progress through and completion of the programme)
- 4. Teaching staff
- 5. Facilities, resources and support
- 6. Organisation and decision-making processes and
- 7. Internal quality culture
- 8. Public interaction



Part IV: MusiQuE Services

- QUALITY ENHANCEMENT REVIEWS for institutions, programmes and joint programmes
 - 'Classic review'
 - Tailor-made services
- ACCREDITATION procedures for institutions, programmes and joint programmes
- JOINT PROCEDURES with national quality assurance and accreditation agencies



Collaboration with national agencies

- MusiQuE coordinates the complete QA or accreditation procedure (Germany, Flanders, Portugal)
- MusiQuE and the national agency organise jointly the whole procedure (merged standards, joint team composition, etc.) (FWB, Russia, Lithuania)



Part V: MusiQuE training for peer-reviewers

- Annual training compulsory with:
 - General introduction to MusiQuE
 - Role-playing
 - Discussions around "acting as a team"

Plans to extend from half to full day



Part VI: MusiQuE's recent development

- MusiQuE as the 'go-to' provider for review and accreditation in music
 - EQAR registration in June 2016



- MusiQuE enabled to conduct formally recognised accreditation procedures
- Standards for pre-college training and music teacher training
- Supporting procedures in multi-disciplinary institutions with various performing arts disciplines
